CRD was implemented by a consortium of international NGOs lead by the International Rescue Committee.</p> <p><b>Program Impact:</b> CRD positively impacted the lives of the conflict affected population, with improvements in capacity among local partners; increase in economic opportunities; and positive change in HIV related behaviors and attitudes. AVSI contributed to the Community Resilience and Psychosocial Support and the HIV/AIDS component, working closely with local community organizations and government institutions. The program as a whole made important contributions to the capacity for integration and conflict resolution in northern Uganda. AVSI developed and has utilized a training curriculum for teachers and social workers on psycho-social care of war-affected youth.</p>
